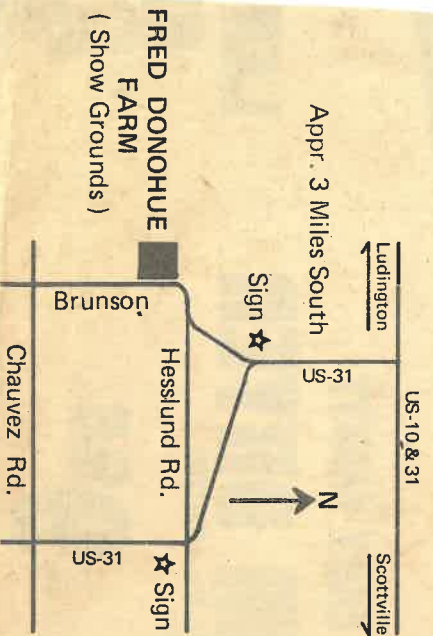

Over 100 engines from yesteryear, both gasoline and steam, will be displayed and working at the Fred Donohue farm off Hesslund Road in Pere Marquette Township for the two-day show.

"We think we've got a pretty good show this year." Club President Charles Hargreaves said during a set-up work session at the grounds.

"We're figuring on having over 100 engines of some kind, including antique cars and threshing machines and shellers for the people to see."

Many of the engines will be in operation, including the thrasher, a corn sheller and grinder, the shingle making rig, buzz saws and more.

Also included in the program for the first time will be a "woman's corner," with household items used by women in the early homes on display.

"We want to have something for everyone," Mrs. Hargreaves explained. "We're even including a baked goods sale."

The show will be held both days from 9 a.m. until 6 p.m. with lunches available at the grounds. There will be rides for anyone wanting to climb aboard a wagon pulled by a team of horses.

Members and engines will be coming from all areas of Western Michigan, including Grand Rapids, Muskegon, Roscommon, Buckley and elsewhere.
